The secret spots of Copenhagen



Bars

Copenhagen was struck by cocktail fever years ago. The result is a magnitude of amazing bars, but don't take our word for it - give them a go!

1. **Curfew** - Stuck between a bookstore and a sketchy jewellery store is this gem for cocktail-connoisseurs. Table service provided. (Vesterbrogade 20, 1620 Copenhagen V)
2. **Nyhavns Champagnebodega** - Basement bar with grower champagnes at refreshingly good prices. There is simply no attitude or arrogance here. A fun bar which sometimes even offers live music. (Lille Strandstræde 10, 1254 Copenhagen K)
3. **Duck and Cover** - Located in the vibrant Vesterbro neighborhood, Duck and Cover offers excellent cocktails making it a great place for drinks before or after visiting one of the many nearby restaurants. (Dannebrogsgade 6, 1660 Copenhagen V)
4. **Brønnum** - The elegance of this cocktail bar is astounding and it is highly recommended to reserve a table in advance. Situated right next to the Royal Danish Theatre, it makes for a perfect post-show location. (August Bournonvilles Passage 1, 1055 Copenhagen K)



The Arts



Copenhagen is widely known for its numerous museums and galleries, however, these exact locations are not for everyone.

5. **The David Collection** - This collection of rare Islamic and older European arts is situated in a 19th century building right next to the King's Garden in inner Copenhagen. The house of the David Collection is a beautiful experience as well, and speaking of location you can enjoy the views of the wonderful garden and Rosenborg Castle in the back. (Kronprinsessegade 30-32, 1306 Copenhagen K)
6. **Cisternerne** - In the old water reservoirs under the hills of old Copenhagen, an intriguing museum has become reality. With ever-changing exhibits, Cisternerne remains a truly remarkable museum experience - feel the chill of the air, listen to the water drops and gaze upon the installations and... don't be afraid of the dark. (Søndermarken opposite the Zoo, 2000 Frederiksberg)
7. **Design Museum Danmark** - Situated in the buildings made for Denmark's very first public hospital in 1751, the newly renovated Danish Design Museum is a vision of historic Danish design and offers a glimpse of what the future might have in store for us. (Bredgade 68, 1260 Copenhagen K)



The Hidden Treasures



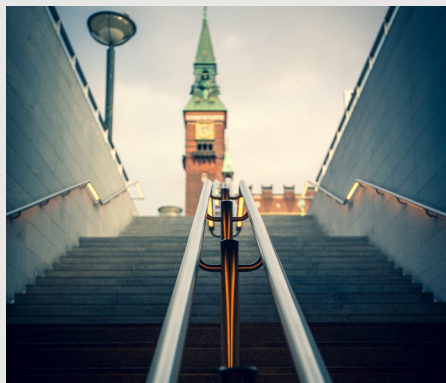
The Capital of Denmark has been highlighted by many as one of the greatest cities in the world. And it really is something special. Perhaps even more so for foreigners traveling to our fair city.

8. **The Marble Church** - On weekends, it is possible to visit the mighty dome of Frederik's Church, lovingly labelled the 'Marble Church' by the Danes. The views from the Dome are amazing and show you the historic part of old Copenhagen in comparison to the quite new Opera House on the other side of the channel. (Frederiks Kirke 'Marmorkirken', Frederiksgade 4, 1265 Copenhagen K)
9. **Jump into the channels of Copenhagen** - Believe it or not - the water in the channels of Copenhagen is so clean that the Danes frequently jump in to refresh themselves. Actually, now there are 'bathing zones' in order to secure the safety of public bathers, as the channels naturally are heavily trafficked by boats and water busses etc. But feel free to jump into your closest zone - it really is lovely!
10. **A Beerwalk at Christiania** - Perhaps you have heard of Christiania? The freetown in the middle of Copenhagen - perhaps most widely known

these days as the birthplace of international superstar, Lukas Graham. At Christiania, they have always been fond of hemp and now you can join in on a spectacular 'Beerwalk' serving beer brewed with hemp as an ingredient. That will be one for the books! (Christiania Bryghus The Lab, Mælkevejen 81A, Christiania, 1440 Copenhagen K)

11. **Mystery Hunt at Christiansborg Castle** - Can you save the Kingdom of Denmark? Or will it fall due to failing arguments or lack of teamwork? This fun and exciting game of Mystery Hunt at Christiansborg Castle is something else. Taking place in the stunning surroundings from which Denmark once was ruled as a monarchy, you are now the only ones able to save us all. (Prins Jørgens Gård 5, 1218 Copenhagen K)
12. **Copenhill** - So here's something unique! Crafty locals have built a skiing and snowboarding hill on top of a waste-to-energy power plant on the outskirts of Copenhagen - by all means; welcome to Copenhill! Here you'll be able to ski all-year round, but if you prefer to hike you can do just that. And reward yourself with an ice-cold drink at the rooftop café and let the stunning view of the Capital
